Bokyung Byun

Concert:

at 7 p.m.

Praised as a leading guitarist of her generation, Bokyung Byun is the recipient of the 2023 Avery Fisher Career Grant and the first female winner of the JoAnn Falletta International Guitar Concerto Competition. Other top honors include first prizes at the Guitar Foundation of America and Montreal International Guitar Competitions.

She has performed as a soloist with orchestras such as the Buffalo Philharmonic and Utah Symphony, and given acclaimed recitals across North America. Critics praise her for her “gorgeous tone, immaculate technique, and sophisticated musicianship.”

Passionate about both classical and contemporary repertoire, Byun co-founded Sounding Board, a new music initiative that promotes collaboration between guitarists and composers. Her recordings have been lauded for their artistry, and her Naxos Laureate Series album was named a Critics’ Choice by American Record Guide.

Born in Seoul, Korea, Byun studied at The Juilliard School and USC, and now serves on faculty at the University of North Texas. She is an Augustine Strings artist and plays a guitar by Dieter Mueller.

TY Zhang is an internationally acclaimed guitarist and the first Chinese winner of the prestigious 2017 Guitar Foundation of America International Concert Artist Competition. His victory launched a 50-city U.S. tour, including his Carnegie Hall debut and a Naxos solo album praised for its mastery and ease. In 2023, he made history again with violinist Strauss Shi as the first violin-guitar duo to win the Concert Artists Guild Competition. TY has performed and taught across Europe, Asia, and the Americas, and is a passionate educator, producing content for platforms like Tonebase and GFATV. He holds degrees from Juilliard and USC, and as of September 2024, serves on faculty at the University of California, Irvine.

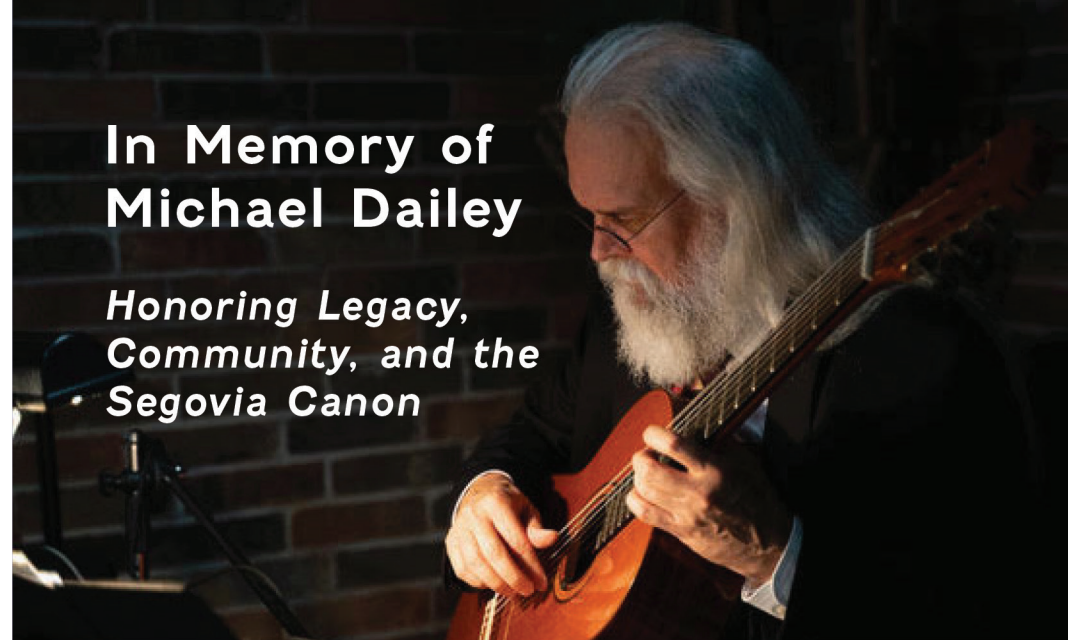

In Memory of Michael Dailey

Honoring Legacy, Community, and the Segovia Canon

Michael Dailey (1946–2021) was a cornerstone of the classical guitar community in Fort Worth and far beyond. Often referred to as Fort Worth's Father of Classical Guitar, Michael founded The Guitar Studio in 1983 with a simple but powerful belief: that great music education is built on relationships, generosity, and a deep respect for tradition.

Michael was a student of Andrés Segovia, and through that lineage he carried forward not only a technical and musical tradition, but a philosophy of mentorship. The Segovia Canon is more than a collection of works or an approach to repertoire. It represents continuity, craftsmanship, discipline, and the passing of knowledge from one generation to the next. It is for this reason that we chose to honor that canon here. It reflects Michael's lifelong commitment to preserving the art form while nurturing young artists within a supportive community.

At the heart of Michael's work was connection. He believed that a studio should be more than a place for lessons. It should be a gathering place where students, families, colleagues, and friends feel invested in one another's growth. Many who passed through The Guitar Studio did not simply study guitar there. They became part of a musical family, connected through shared experiences, mutual encouragement, and a love of the instrument.

That spirit of connection continues today through The Guitar Studio, The Guitar Studio Foundation, and this festival. Building meaningful artistic communities takes time, care, and trust. Michael understood that music thrives when people feel seen, supported, and inspired to contribute something lasting.

We are grateful to carry his legacy forward and to share it with the wider community he helped shape."

Gabriel Bianco

Gabriel Bianco is considered one of today's leading classical guitarists. He has won first prize in numerous international competitions, performed in over fifty countries across every continent, and recorded eight CDs.

His honors include ADAMI "Classical Revelation" (2011) and first prizes at major competitions such as the Guitar Foundation of America (USA), Andrés Segovia Competition (Spain), Hubert Käppel Competition (Germany), Gitarre Forum Wien (Austria), Silesian Autumn (Poland), and Barbezieux (France), among others.

He has appeared in concert at prestigious venues worldwide, including the Théâtre du Châtelet, La Folle Journée de Nantes, Tchaikovsky Hall in Moscow, the Herbst Theatre in San Francisco, the Central Conservatory of Beijing, Yamaha Hall in Tokyo, the Kyiv Philharmonic, the Zurich Opera, and the Lausanne Opera.

A passionate chamber musician, Bianco has been a member of Quatuor Éclisses since its founding in 2012, for which he has created numerous arrangements and recorded four albums with Ad Vitam Records. He also collaborates with mezzo-soprano Marina Viotti and has recorded with oboist Michaela Hrabankova.

His solo discography includes recordings for Naxos and Ad Vitam Records, featuring works by Bach, Mertz, Koshkin, Da Milano, Scarlatti, Regondi, and Paganini. He is also actively involved in the creation of contemporary music, collaborating with composers such as Sergio Assad, Karol Beffa, Atanas Ourkouzounov, and Thomas Viloteau.

Born in Paris in 1988, Gabriel Bianco studied at the Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris under Olivier Chassain, earning top honors in guitar and chamber music. Since 2018, he has served as Senior Docent at the Conservatorium van Amsterdam, where he teaches guitar and directs the classical guitar department. He performs exclusively on Savarez strings.

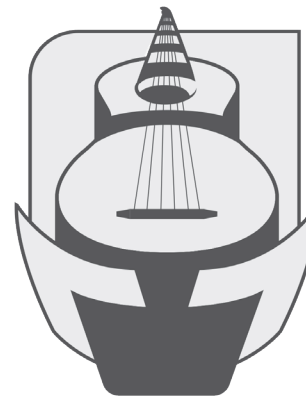
Cuban-born René Izquierdo is a celebrated classical guitarist and passionate educator known for his expressive performances and dedication to community engagement. Hailed for his “unforgettable versatility, sensitivity, and sublime musicianship” (Classical Guitar Magazine), he seamlessly blends technical mastery with emotional depth to create intimate musical experiences.

René performs over 70 concerts annually, appearing as a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral guest across the Americas, Europe, and Asia. His appearances include prestigious venues such as Carnegie Hall, the Manaus Opera House, and Taiwan’s National Recital Hall.

A committed lifelong learner, René’s diverse recordings highlight underrepresented works and new compositions. As a teacher, he inspires students worldwide to engage both analytically and emotionally with music.

STEVE GOSS

Guest Lecturer/Juror

Stephen Goss's music receives hundreds of performances worldwide each year. It has been recorded on over a hundred albums by more than a dozen record labels, including EMI, Decca, Virgin Classics, Naxos, and Deutsche Grammophon. His output embraces multiple genres: orchestral and choral works, chamber music, and solo pieces.

Goss's work is marked by a fascination with time and place – both immediate and remote – and the musical styles that evoke them. In many of his compositions, contrasting styles are juxtaposed through abrupt changes of gear. His compositional voice is shaped by his parallel career as a guitarist – that is to say, as a performer, transcriber, arranger, improviser and collaborator with other composers and performers. Not surprisingly, his music often tests the boundaries between all these activities and original composition.

Several of Goss's recent projects have involved the legendary guitarist John Williams, including his Guitar Concerto, which Williams recorded and played on tour with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra. Some of the world's leading orchestras to have performed his works include the Russian National Orchestra, the Oregon Symphony Orchestra, the Orquesta Sinfónica Nacional de Colombia, BBC NOW, the China National Symphony Orchestra, The Scottish Chamber Orchestra, and The Barcelona Symphony Orchestra.

Commissions have come from percussionist Dame Evelyn Glennie, cellist Natalie Clein, flautist William Bennett, lutenist Nigel North, and tenor Ian Bostridge; as well as guitarists David Russell, Xuefei Yang, Zoran Dukić, Miloš Karadaglić, Aniello Desiderio, Artyom Dervoed, and Łukasz Kuropaczewski. Goss's eclectic approach has led to collaborations with artists as diverse as Alt-J, Avi Avital, and Andrew Lloyd Webber.

As a guitarist, Steve has worked with Tōru Takemitsu, Hans Werner Henze, Peter Maxwell Davies and Elliott Carter, and toured and recorded extensively with the TETRA Guitar Quartet.

Stephen Goss is Chair of Composition at the University of Surrey (UK), Director of the International Guitar Research Centre, and a Professor of Guitar at the Royal Academy of Music in London. In 2018 he was made a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Music, an honour limited to 300 living people. He was born in Wales on 2nd February 1964.
